What do they mean?

Introduction

The use of the CFPA-E Diploma or Certificate logos on business cards, websites, e-mail or personal specifications (CVs) indicates that the individual user has completed the named course of study which has been approved / accredited by CFPA-Europe through the work of its Training Commission and delivered by one of its participant members.

CFPA-E Courses

The syllabus of each course approved by CFPA-E has been developed through the Training Commission by experts representing its member organisations from across Europe and aims to offer a pan European perspective on the subject being studied. Each syllabus contains an element of flexibility which allows each participating member organisation to decide how the training will be delivered. Each qualification has the same value, no matter which organisation provides the training. Each participant member is subject to published quality standards to ensure consistency and quality across all CFPA-E course delivery.
