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4b:	 Briggs presented the feedback/information from the MC: Peer review should regularly be conducted and documented so the process is transparent for all parties. Any additional information that should be included in the checklist shall be submitted by the member countries by the next meeting. The CFPA-E Booklet will now only be published electronically. All members should send Attest documentation to CFPA in order to have a more complete overview. It was noted this may be difficult to do for certain attests as there are far more issued per year than certificates/diplomas (e.g. Hot Works has 85,000/year). This will be discussed at the next meeting. All members should check with their local regulations regarding data protection. This way CFPA-E can legally define a strategy in order to bring in more readers. Briggs noted that all courses should be assigned at least one guideline. 4c:	 Guidelines Commission The GC has agreed upon 2 new guidelines, tens and warehouses. There are a number of other guidelines in the pipeline including more on natural hazards. 		
4d:	 Security Commission The past meeting was spent completing a number of guidelines. A new guideline on cyber security has been proposed and should be completed by the end of the next meeting. It was also noted that VdS and CNPP are looking to offer more courses on cyber security. 		
4e:	 Marketing and Information Commission The MIC has introduced a new research section on the CFPA-E website. The next sections to be updated are the guideline and training. The newsletter is always looking for topics, so the MIC asks that all members report any relevant events or news so that it can be included. The MIC has been evaluating the possibility of joining trade fairs in order to boost the image of CFPA-E.

5a:	 Peer Review Once the Questionnaire has been completed, the Peer Reviews can continue regularly.

Wording for Museums and Shopping Centres to be standardized. Security Management and Technical Cycle to be moved to level 6 and 5 respectively. The targets for the Fire Safety group are to be updated for all levels to reflect appropriate groups. Thermography of Electrical Installations to be moved to level 3.
